# The Gridiron

Gridirons as we know them today originated in 1885, when a group of reporters in Washinghon, D.C., became actors for an evening and lampooned the prominent people of the day. Gridirons are now held in major cities throughout the nation with the foremost among them being the National Press Club's annual roasting of national politicians with the president himself in the audience.

This is the first gridiron ever presented by members of the Northwest Arkansas press corps. Area politicians and other famous figures should beware—it won't be the last.

# The Sigma Delta Chi Chapter

The Ozarks Chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists, Sigma Delta Chi (SDX), is the Northwest Arkansas branch of a worldwide association. Journalisms professionals, educators and students are united in the organization. SDX seeks to raise the competence of its members, to recognize outstanding achievement by journalists, to recruit and hold able young talent for journalism, to advance the cause of freedom of information and to elevate the prestige of journalism.

The Ozarks Chapter is one of the newest groups to be chartered by the SDX national board of directors. The charter was granted in August 1977 to the local organization of newspaper, radio, television and public relations employees and journalism teachers.

The chapter is presenting the gridiron as a fund-raising event. It is hoped that journalism scholarships and public seminars featuring nationally-prominent journalists will be funded from the gridiron's proceeds.
