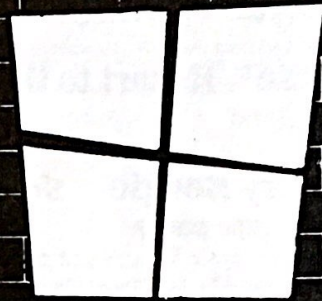

Gridirons now are presented in major cities throughout the nation with the foremost among them being the National Press Club's annual roasting of national politicians with the President in the audience.
