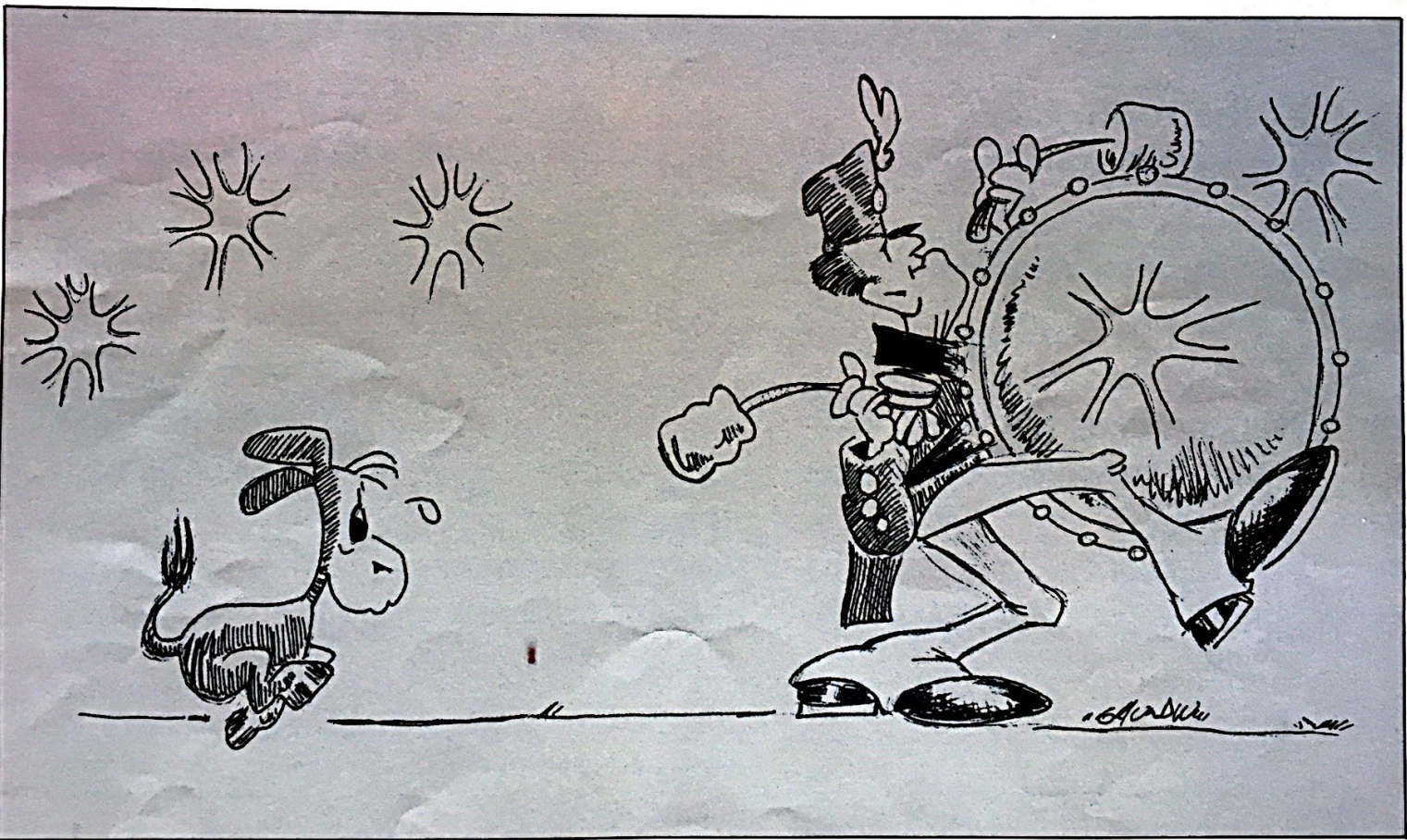

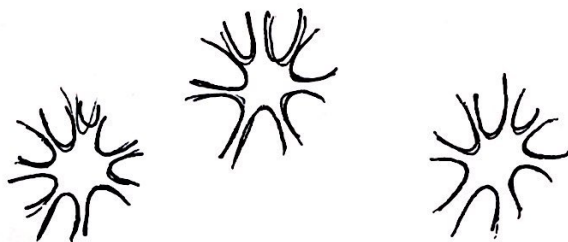

The Ozarks Chapter charter was granted in August 1977 to the local organization of newspaper, radio and television reporters, and journalism educators.

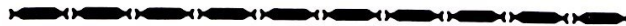
