

HOW IS THE GRIDIRON SHOW WRITTEN?

The writers began their twice-weekly sessions with a list of all the news events that stuck in their minds (and in their craws) from the last year.

As writers submit scripts, they are picked apart – making sure

- they don't repeat a topic that's already covered
- the show isn't lopsided, that is, covering too much from one county and not the other
- and, oh yeah that it's funny.


It's that last part that keeps the writers concentrated on one skit for a week or more. They want it to be funny not only to people who are "in" on the joke, but also for those who don't keep up with local politics and events the way journalists and news junkies do.

Revisions continue up until the show begins – and sometimes between Friday and Saturday nights!

Occasionally, but only occasionally, a skit or song will be the same way on stage that it was originally written. In most cases, it's hard for the writers to remember "who wrote" a skit because it's gone through so many hands.

Without a doubt, the show is the creation of a committee.






